The people who called yesterday want to buy this house.

Grammar: Relative Clause with 'who'

- B: So, the woman who called yesterday wants to buy this house.

- A: Remember I talked to someone on the phone yesterday?
- B: Yes, and?
- A: A friend recommended a prospective customer, so I called him. It turned out he was very interested in this house.
- B: So, the person whom you called yesterday wants to buy this house.

There was only one person. + Our MD spoke to him at the party last night.
